English: We will be visiting the Antarctica and writing explanatory texts on how to survive in these conditions. This will be a cross-curricular topic which will also be covered in Geography and History. We'll become explorers for the day and visit our Forest School. Next term we will be looking at Viking Stories and the Coming of the Normans.

Maths: We will be solving two step word problems, Addition and subtraction up to 4 digits using column addition and subtraction, Use bar graphs, pictograms and tables to answer questions, HT1s x 1s using partitioning, grid and formal methods, Divide one digit and two digit numbers by 10 and 100, Measurement (perimeter and area)

Practical activities to do at home: Please encourage your child to tell the time regularly and look at bus and train timetables when possible. It would be great if they could get involved in shopping by working out totals and change. Any Mental Maths is always useful and keep up that Doodle Maths!

Your child is expected to know up to the 12 x tables by the end of year 4, the tables your child is working will be noted down in their homework book. Our weekly multiplication test is on Mondays.

Science: We will be learning about All Living Things and their Habitats and food chains

RE: We will be continuing to look at Sikhism and what it means to have a commitment to a Faith. We Will then learn about The Church and Christianity.
