Phonics:

In phonics we are currently working on phase 1 aspect 7 this is oral blending and segmenting. This is an important pre reading skill to learn. Twinkl have free resources on their home learning section. <https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resources/3-5-early-years-parents/early-literacy-phonics-3-5-years-early-years-parents/phase-1-phonics-early-literacy-phonics-3-5-years-early-years-parents>

When the children have mastered the skill of oral blending and segmenting, they can move onto phase 2 phonics where they will be introduced to the grapheme-phoneme (letters and sounds). <https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resources/3-5-early-years-parents/early-literacy-phonics-3-5-years-early-years-parents/phase-2-phonics-early-literacy-phonics-3-5-years-early-years-parents>

If you are using YouTube to listen to the correct sound of the letter please make sure it is British English as American English is pronounced differently. The children like to listen to the jolly phonics songs and a good CBeebies programme is Alphablocks.

Writing:

Lots of drawing and lots of copying their names. Once able to copy their name encourage the children to write their name from memory. Encourage child to hold the pencil with thumb and 2 fingers.

Reading:

Read a story book to your child every day.
